- Abstract and full paper must be submitted in soft copy only (both MS Word format and PDF).
- Participants are required to make their own arrangements for travel and accommodation. The organizers will not provide travel allowances or lodging facilities.
- Paper should be presented in the seminar by author or co-author and presented paper only will be considered for publication (Conference Proceedings with ISBN) with additional cost.
